RESIDENTS at Crosshill Nursing and Residential home had a surprise recently when they received a very special visitor – a Dartmoor pony!

The residents were delighted to be able to stroke it and for those with more profound physical and / or mental problems, feel its presence. Staff, residents, their friends and family were thrilled with the visit. The handler, Katy Smith, even took the 12.2 hands high pony along to one of the bedrooms where a resident, who had worked with horses during his working life, was in bed. He too was over the moon with the visit.

Diana, the senior activities co-ordinator at Crosshill, organised the visit. She said, "The pony was brought in through the garden door and I was amazed by the joy it brought to each resident. They really enjoyed the experience."

She continued, "This is the first time in my life that I have seen a pony inside a building and it was amazing."

Every precaution was taken to ensure the visit complied with regulations. The pony's feet were cleaned before entering the home and all infection control regulations were observed during the visit.

"We sometimes don't realise what it is like to be a resident in a nursing home," added Diana. "And this visit brought the outside into the home. It also brought back lovely memories for some. The pony was very docile, very sweet and did everything
